Born 1872. He represented Wales sixteen times between 1906 and 1911, either as an outside half or wing three-quarter, and in 1910 he scored one of his country's two tries when Wales played at Twickenham for the first time. Gibbs was also in the Cardiff team that, with **E. Gwyn Nicholls** as captain gained the historic victory over the South African side in 1906. He died 28 November 1938.
