Born at Llanboidy, Carmarthenshire, son of a successful farmer. He became a member at Henllan or Rhydyceisiaid, Carmarthenshire. In 1720 he was a minister at Denbigh. He married the daughter of his predecessor **Thomas Baddy**. He died in 1737 and was buried at Whitchurch, Denbigh. **David Jardine** was his son.
